John 1:14-And the Word became flesh, and [k]dwelt among us, and we saw His glory, glory as of [l]the only begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth.

Matt 20:22-23-But Jesus answered, “You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I am about to drink?” They *said to Him, “We are able.” ²³ He *said to them, “My cup you shall drink; but to sit on My right and on My left, this is not Mine to give, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared by My Father.”

Matt. 16:21-22- From that time [r]Jesus began to show His disciples that He must go to Jerusalem, and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and be raised up on the third day. ²² Peter took Him aside and began to rebuke Him, saying, “[s]God forbid *it*, Lord! This shall never [t]happen to You.”

Matt. 26:75- And Peter remembered the word which Jesus had said, “Before a rooster crows, you will deny Me three times.” And he went out and wept bitterly.

Zech. 4:6- Then he ^[a]said to me, “This is the word of the LORD to Zerubbabel saying, ‘Not by might nor by power, but by My Spirit,’ says the LORD of hosts.

Philippians 4:13- I can do all things ^[a]through Him who strengthens me.

Matt. 14:28-33-²⁸ Peter said to Him, “Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You on the water.” ²⁹ And He said, “Come!” And Peter got out of the boat, and walked on the water and came toward Jesus. ³⁰ But seeing the wind, he became frightened, and beginning to sink, he cried out, “Lord, save me!” ³¹ Immediately Jesus stretched out His hand and took hold of him, and *said to him, “You of little faith, why did you doubt?” ³² When they got into the boat, the wind stopped. ³³ And those who were in the boat worshiped Him, saying, “You are certainly God’s Son!”

Matt. 16:13-23-Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, He was asking His disciples, “Who do people say that the Son of Man is?” ¹⁴ And they said, “Some *say* John the Baptist; and others, ^[h]Elijah; but still others, ^[i]Jeremiah, or one of the prophets.” ¹⁵ He *said to them, “But who do you say that I am?” ¹⁶ Simon Peter answered, “You are ^[j]the Christ, the Son of the living God.” ¹⁷ And Jesus said to him, “Blessed are you, Simon ^[k]Barjona, because flesh and blood did not reveal *this* to you, but My Father who is in heaven. ¹⁸ I also say to you

that you are ^[l]Peter, and upon this ^[m]rock I will build My church; and the gates of Hades will not overpower it. ¹⁹ I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; and whatever you bind on earth ^[n]shall have been bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth ^[o]shall have been loosed in heaven.” ²⁰ Then He ^[p]warned the disciples that they should tell no one that He was ^[q]the Christ. ²¹ From that time ^[r]Jesus began to show His disciples that He must go to Jerusalem, and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and be raised up on the third day. ²² Peter took Him aside and began to rebuke Him, saying, “^[s]God forbid *it*, Lord! This shall never ^[t]happen to You.” ²³ But He turned and said to Peter, “Get behind Me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to Me; for you are not setting your mind on ^[u]God’s interests, but man’s.”

John 13:36-38- Simon Peter *said to Him, “Lord, where are You going?” Jesus answered, “Where I go, you cannot follow Me now; but you will follow later.” ³⁷ Peter *said to Him, “Lord, why can I not follow You right now? I will lay down my life for You.” ³⁸ Jesus *answered, “Will you lay down your life for Me? Truly, truly, I say to you, a rooster will not crow until you deny Me three times.

John 18;10-11, 17, 25-27- Simon Peter then, having a sword, drew it and struck the high priest’s slave, and cut off his right ear; and the slave’s name was Malchus. ¹¹ So Jesus said to Peter, “Put the sword into the sheath; the cup which the Father has given Me, shall I not drink it?”... Then the slave-girl who kept the door *said to Peter, “You are not also *one* of this man’s disciples, are you?” He *said, “I am not.”... Now Simon Peter was standing and warming himself. So they said to him, “You

are not also *one* of His disciples, are you?” He denied *it*, and said, “I am not.”²⁶ One of the slaves of the high priest, being a relative of the one whose ear Peter cut off, *said, “Did I not see you in the garden with Him?”²⁷ Peter then denied *it* again, and immediately a rooster crowed.

Matt. 26:75- And Peter remembered the word which Jesus had said, “Before a rooster crows, you will deny Me three times.” And he went out and wept bitterly.

Gen. 37:2-These are *the records* of the generations of Jacob. Joseph, when seventeen years of age, was pasturing the flock with his brothers while he was *still* a youth, along with the sons of Bilhah and the sons of Zilpah, his father’s wives. And Joseph brought back a bad report about them to their father.

Gen. 37:9-10- Now he ^[f]had still another dream, and related it to his brothers, and said, “Lo, I have ^[g]had still another dream; and behold, the sun and the moon and eleven stars were bowing down to me.”¹⁰ He related *it* to his father and to his brothers; and his father rebuked him and said to him, “What is this dream that you have ^[h]had? Shall I and your mother and your brothers actually come to bow ourselves down before you to the ground?”

Gen. 41:40-41- You shall be over my house, and according to your ^[ag]command all my people shall ^[ah]do homage; only in the throne I will be greater than you.”⁴¹ Pharaoh said to Joseph, “See, I have set you over all the land of Egypt.”

Gen. 41:46- Now Joseph was thirty years old when he ^[an]stood before Pharaoh, king of Egypt. And Joseph went out from the presence of Pharaoh and went through all the land of Egypt.

Acts 7:22-29-Moses was educated in all the learning of the Egyptians, and he was a man of power in words and deeds.

²³ But when he was approaching the age of forty, it entered his ^[o]mind to visit his brethren, the sons of Israel. ²⁴ And when he saw one *of them* being treated unjustly, he defended him and took vengeance for the oppressed by striking down the Egyptian.

²⁵ And he supposed that his brethren understood that God was granting them ^[p]deliverance ^[q]through him, but they did not understand. ²⁶ On the following day he appeared to them as they were fighting together, and he tried to reconcile them in peace, saying, ‘Men, you are brethren, why do you injure one another?’

²⁷ But the one who was injuring his neighbor pushed him away, saying, ‘WHO MADE YOU A RULER AND JUDGE OVER US? ²⁸ YOU DO NOT MEAN TO KILL ME AS YOU KILLED THE EGYPTIAN YESTERDAY, DO YOU?’ ²⁹ At this remark, MOSES FLED AND BECAME AN ALIEN IN THE LAND OF ^[r]MIDIAN, where he became the father of two sons.

Exod. 3:1-2- Now Moses was pasturing the flock of Jethro his father-in-law, the priest of Midian; and he led the flock to the ^[a]west side of the wilderness and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. ² The angel of the LORD appeared to him in a blazing fire from the midst of ^[b]a bush; and he looked, and behold, the bush was burning with fire, yet the bush was not consumed.

Exod. 3:10-11- Therefore, come now, and I will send you to Pharaoh, so that you may bring My people, the sons of Israel, out of Egypt.”¹¹ But Moses said to God, “Who am I, that I should go to Pharaoh, and that I should bring the sons of Israel out of Egypt?”

Acts 9:15- But the Lord said to him, “Go, for he is a chosen ^[g]instrument of Mine, to bear My name before the Gentiles and kings and the sons of Israel

Acts 9:20- and immediately he *began* to proclaim Jesus in the synagogues, ^[h]saying, “He is the Son of God.”

Gal 1:17-18- nor did I go up to Jerusalem to those who were apostles before me; but I went away to Arabia, and returned once more to Damascus.¹⁸ Then three years later I went up to Jerusalem to ^[a]become acquainted with Cephas, and stayed with him fifteen days.

Rom 12:2-And do not be conformed to this ^[a]world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may ^[b]prove what the will of God is, that which is good and ^[c]acceptable and perfect.

Philip 3:4-6- although I myself might have confidence even in the flesh. If anyone else has a mind to put confidence in the flesh, I far more:⁵ circumcised the eighth day, of the nation of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; as to the Law, a Pharisee;⁶ as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to the righteousness which is in the Law, found blameless.

Acts 22:3- “I am a Jew, born in Tarsus of Cilicia, but brought up in this city, educated ^[a]under Gamaliel, ^[b]strictly according to the law of our fathers, being zealous for God just as you all are today.

2 Cor 12:10- Therefore I am well content with weaknesses, with ^[a]insults, with distresses, with persecutions, with difficulties, for Christ’s sake; for when I am weak, then I am strong.

Heb. 13:20-21- Now the God of peace, who brought up from the dead the great Shepherd of the sheep ^[a]through the blood of the eternal covenant, *even* Jesus our Lord, ²¹ equip you in every good thing to do His will, working in us that which is pleasing in His sight, through Jesus Christ, to whom *be* the glory forever and ever. Amen.
