

Context 1st John 2:19-21



"The purpose of 1 John, though widely discussed, appears to be to reassure believers whose faith is wavering because of the departure of some who had turned out to be false teachers. They had been trusted but the humanity of Jesus and the proper role of love and obedience in the Christian life."

"The people who remained [believers] were now confused about their spiritual condition. Trusted members of the community are shown to be false; where does that leave the people who formerly trusted them?"


Historical Context 1st John 2:19-21



"The false teachers had renounced the apostolic teaching about Christ, for they were not of God, but the readers (the implied audience of 1 John) are of God and can be certain that any flaws in their lives are dealt with by Jesus's work. For believers, the penalty is paid (expiation) and the wrath of God is averted."





- An excuse not to fellowship with other believers






How does this apply to me?:

2. Mutual Anointing 1st John 2:19

(1 Jn. 2:20 & Lk. 4:18) Chrisma -

"mostly=oil for anointing... taken to mean anointing with the Holy Spirit" (BDAG)

- 1. All reasoning becomes impossible;
- 2. Undercuts knowledge & beliefs;
- 3. Pointless to "give a reason for the faith that is in you";
 - Leads to intellectual superficiality, sensate decadence, abuse of power, cynicism & scorn, & marketing manipulation





<u>Truth Defined:</u>

Truth is that which corresponds to reality, identifies things as they actually are, can never fail, diminish, change, or be extinguished, must be able to be expressed in logical propositions (t+t = true), and is sourced in the God of the Bible who is the Author of all truth.
