5. Can the government go too far in deterring terrorism?

Rev. 19:11-And I saw heaven opened, and behold, a white horse, and He who sat on it *is* called Faithful and True, and <u>in</u> <u>righteousness</u> He judges and <u>wages war</u>.

Art I sec. 8-Congress shall have the power...To declare war

Art. 11 sec. 8-The President shall be the commander in chief of the Army and Nay of the United States

Rom. 13:3-For rulers are not a cause of fear for ^[d]good behavior, but for evil. Do you want to have no fear of authority? Do what is good and you will have praise from the same.

Prov. 21:2-Every man's way is right in his own eyes, But the LORD weighs the hearts.

Rom. 12:18-If possible, so far as it depends on you, be at peace with all men.

Luke 14:31-Or what king, when he sets out to meet another king in battle, will not first sit down and consider whether he is strong enough with ten thousand *men* to encounter the one coming against him with twenty thousand?

Rom. 12:21-Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

Ps. 68:30-Rebuke the beasts in the reeds, The herd of bulls with the calves of the peoples, Trampling under foot the pieces of silver; **He has scattered the peoples who delight in war**.

Deut. 20:10-12-10 "When you approach a city to fight against it, you shall offer it terms of peace. 11 If it agrees to make peace with you and opens to you, then all the people who are found in it shall become your forced labor and shall serve you.

¹² However, if it does not make peace with you, but makes war against you, then you shall besiege it.

Deut. 20:13-14-¹³ When the LORD your God gives it into your hand, you shall strike all the men in it with the edge of the sword. ¹⁴ Only the women and the children and the animals and all that is in the city, all its spoil, you shall take as booty for yourself; and you shall use the spoil of your enemies which the LORD your God has given you.

6. What legitimate methods can the government employ in deterring terrorism?

Obadiah 11-On the day that you stood aloof, On the day that strangers carried off his wealth, And foreigners entered his gate And cast lots for Jerusalem—You too were as one of them.

Josh. 2:1-Then Joshua the son of Nun sent two men as **spies** secretly...saying, "Go, view the land, especially Jericho." So they went and came into the house of a harlot whose name was Rahab, and lodged there.

Prov. 13:24-He who withholds his rod hates his son, But he who loves him disciplines him diligently.
