
#### **Good and Bad Kings**




#### 2 Samuel 7:12-16


"When your days are complete and you lie down with your fathers, I will raise up your <u>descendant</u> after you, who will come forth from you, and I will establish his kingdom. <sup>13</sup> He shall build a house for My name, and I will establish <u>the throne of his kingdom forever</u>. <sup>14</sup> I will be a father to him and he will be a son to Me; when he commits iniquity, I will correct him with the rod of men and the strokes of the sons of men, <sup>15</sup> but My lovingkindness shall not depart from him, as I took *it* away from Saul, whom I removed from before you. <sup>16</sup> <u>Your house and your kingdom shall endure before Me forever; your throne shall be established forever.</u>" <sup>17</sup> In accordance with all these words and all this vision, so Nathan spoke <u>to David</u>."

How futile for conservative scholars to ignore that fact and to seek to find literal fulfillment of those prophecies in history or in the church, when those predictions refer to events yet future and have no application whatever to the church."
