

Without any battle, . . sparing Babylon . . . any calamity... I am Cyrus...king of Babylon....When I entered Babylon...under jubilation and rejoicing...troops walked around Babylon...in peace, I did not allow anybody to terrorize (any place) of the [country of Sumer] and Akkad. I strove for peace in Babylon..and in all his (other) sacred cities...I returned to (these) sacred cities on the other side of the Tigris, the sanctuaries of which have been in ruins for a long time, the images which (used) to live therein and established for them permanent sanctuaries.

<u>13</u>

Dan. 3:12-There are certain Jews whom you have appointed over the administration of the province of Babylon, *namely* Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego. These men, O king, have disregarded you; they do not serve your gods or worship the golden image which you have set up.

Esther 3:5-When Haman saw that Mordecai neither bowed down nor paid homage to him, Haman was filled with rage.

Esther 3:8-Then Haman said to King Ahasuerus, "There is a certain people scattered and dispersed among the peoples in all the provinces of your kingdom; their laws are different from *those* of all *other* people and they do not observe the king's laws, so it is not in the king's interest to let them remain.

John 14:6-Jesus *said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father but through Me.

Acts 4:12-And there is salvation in no one else; for there is no other name under heaven that has been given among men by which we must be saved.

1 Tim. 2:5-For there is one God, *and* one mediator also between God and men, *the* man Christ Jesus

Matt. 7:13-14-Enter through the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the way is broad that leads to destruction, and there are many who enter through it. ¹⁴ For the gate is small and the way is narrow that leads to life, and there are few who find it.

Dan. 6:18-Then the king went off to his palace and spent the night fasting, and no entertainment was brought before him; and his sleep fled from him.

<u>15</u>

Esther 1:19-If it pleases the king, let a royal [i]edict be issued by him and let it be written in **the laws of Persia and Media so that it cannot** [i]be repealed, that Vashti may no longer come into the presence of King Ahasuerus, and let the king give her royal position to another who is more worthy than she.

Esther 8:8-Now you write to the Jews [a] as you see fit, in the king's name, and seal *it* with the king's signet ring; **for a decree** which is written in the name of the king and sealed with the king's signet ring may not be revoked.

2 Tim. 3:12-Indeed, all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will be persecuted.

Dan. 3:25-He said, "Look! I see four men loosed *and* walking *about* in the midst of the fire [v]without harm, and the appearance of the fourth is like a son of *the* gods!"

Dan. 3:28-Nebuchadnezzar responded and said, "Blessed be the God of Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego, who has sent His

angel and delivered His servants who put their trust in Him, [aa] violating the king's command, and yielded up their bodies so as not to serve or worship any god except their own God.

Dan. 12:1- Now at that time Michael, the great prince who stands *guard* over the sons of your people, will arise. And there will be a time of distress such as never occurred since there was a nation until that time; and at that time your people, everyone who is found written in the book, will be rescued.

Dan. 3:27- The satraps, the prefects, the governors and the king's high officials gathered around *and* saw in regard to these men that the fire had no [w]effect on [x]the bodies of these men nor was the hair of their head singed, nor were their [y]trousers [z]damaged, nor had the smell of fire *even* come upon them.

Gen. 12:3- And I will bless those who bless you, And the one who ^[c]curses you I will ^[d]curse. And in you all the families of the earth will be blessed.

Exod. 4:22- Then you shall say to Pharaoh, 'Thus says the LORD, "Israel is My son, My firstborn.

Exod. 1:22- Then Pharaoh commanded all his people, saying, "Every son who is born [u]you are to cast into the Nile, and every daughter you are to keep alive."

Esther 7:9-10- Then Harbonah, one of the eunuchs who *were* before the king said, "Behold indeed, the gallows standing at Haman's house fifty cubits high, which Haman made for

Mordecai who spoke good on behalf of the king!" And the king said, "Hang him on it." ¹⁰ So they hanged Haman on the ^[h]gallows which he had prepared for Mordecai, and the king's anger subsided.

Dt. 6:6-7- These words, which I am commanding you today, shall be on your heart. ⁷ You shall teach them diligently to your sons and shall talk of them when you sit in your house and when you walk by the way and when you lie down and when you rise up.

Josh. 6:21- They ^[i]utterly destroyed everything in the city, both man and woman, young and old, and ox and sheep and donkey, with the edge of the sword.

Dan. 4:34-35-But at the end of [ag]that period, I, Nebuchadnezzar, raised my eyes toward heaven and my [ah]reason returned to me, and I blessed the Most High and praised and honored Him who lives forever; For His dominion is an everlasting dominion, And His kingdom *endures* from generation to generation.³⁵ "All the inhabitants of the earth are accounted as nothing, But He does according to His will in the host of heaven And *among* the inhabitants of earth; And no one can [ai] ward off His hand Or say to Him, 'What have You done?'

Dan. 3:28-Nebuchadnezzar responded and said, "Blessed be the God of Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego, who has sent His
