Gen. 39:2-4-The LORD was with Joseph, so he became a ^[b]successful man. And he was in the house of his master, the Egyptian. ³ Now his master saw that the LORD was with him and *how* the LORD caused all that he did to prosper in his hand. ⁴ So Joseph found favor in his sight and ^[c]became his personal servant; and he made him overseer over his house, and all that he owned he put in his ^[d]charge.

Esther 8:8-Now you write to the Jews ^[a]as you see fit, in the king's name, and seal *it* with the king's signet ring; for a decree which is written in the name of the king and sealed with the king's signet ring may not be revoked.

1 Kgs. 8:44-When Your people go out to battle against [u]their enemy, by whatever way You shall send them, and they pray to the LORD [v]toward the city which You have chosen and the house which I have built for Your name

Dan. 3:12-There are certain Jews whom you have appointed over the administration of the province of Babylon, *namely* Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego. These men, O king, have disregarded you; they do not serve your gods or worship the golden image which you have set up.

Esther 3:5-When Haman saw that Mordecai neither bowed down nor paid homage to him, Haman was filled with rage.

Esther 3:8-Then Haman said to King Ahasuerus, "There is a certain people scattered and dispersed among the peoples in all the provinces of your kingdom; their laws are different from *those* of all *other* people and they do not observe the king's laws, so it is not in the king's interest to let them remain.

John 14:6-Jesus *said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father but through Me.

Dan. 11:1-In the first year of Darius the Mede, [a] I arose to be [b] an encouragement and a protection for him.

<u>24</u>

Gen. 12:3- And I will bless those who bless you, And the one who ^[c]curses you I will ^[d]curse. And in you all the families of the earth will be blessed.

Exod. 4:22- Then you shall say to Pharaoh, 'Thus says the LORD, "Israel is My son, My firstborn.

Exod. 1:22- Then Pharaoh commanded all his people, saying, "Every son who is born ^[u]you are to cast into the Nile, and every daughter you are to keep alive."

Esther 7:9-10- Then Harbonah, one of the eunuchs who *were* before the king said, "Behold indeed, the gallows standing at Haman's house fifty cubits high, which Haman made for Mordecai who spoke good on behalf of the king!" And the king said, "Hang him on it." ¹⁰ So they hanged Haman on the ^[h]gallows which he had prepared for Mordecai, and the king's anger subsided.

Rom. 12:19- Never take your own revenge, beloved, but ^[p]leave room for the wrath *of God*, for it is written, "VENGEANCE IS MINE, I WILL REPAY," says the Lord.
