

Matt. 7:7-11-Ask, and it will be given to you; ^[d]seek, and you will find; ^[e]knock, and it will be opened to you. ⁸ For everyone who asks receives, and he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks it will be opened. ⁹ Or what man is there among you ^[f]who, when his son asks for a loaf, ^[g]will give him a stone? ¹⁰ Or ^[h]if he asks for a fish, he will not give him a snake, will he? ¹¹ If you then, being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father who is in heaven give what is good to those who ask Him!

1 Thess. 5:17-pray without ceasing.

1 John 1:9-If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Philip. 4:19-And my God will supply [o] all your needs according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus.

1 John 5:14- This is the confidence which we have ^[1]before Him, that, if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us.

Jas. 4:1-3- What is the source of quarrels and conflicts among you? ^[b]Is not the source your pleasures that wage war in your members? ² You lust and do not have; *so* you commit murder. You are envious and cannot obtain; *so* you fight and quarrel. You do not have because you do not ask. ³ You ask and do not receive, because you ask ^[c] with wrong motives, so that you may spend *it* ^[d] on your pleasures.

Acts 12:5- So Peter was kept in the prison, but prayer for him was being made fervently by the church to God.

Acts 12:12-16- And when he realized *this*, he went to the house of Mary, the mother of John who was also called Mark, where many were gathered together and were praying. ¹³ When he knocked at the door of the gate, a servant-girl named Rhoda came to answer. ¹⁴ When she recognized Peter's voice, because of her joy she did not open the gate, but ran in and announced that Peter was standing in front of the gate. ¹⁵ They said to her, "You are out of your mind!" But she kept insisting that it was so. They kept saying, "It is his angel." ¹⁶ But Peter continued knocking; and when they had opened *the door*, they saw him and were amazed.

Dan. 12:1- Now at that time Michael, the great prince who stands *guard* over the sons of your people, will arise. And there will be a time of distress such as never occurred since there was a nation until that time; and at that time your people, everyone who is found written in the book, will be rescued.

Luke 1:19- The angel answered and said to him, "I am Gabriel, who stands in the presence of God, and I have been sent to speak to you and to bring you this good news.

Luke 1:26- Now in the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city in Galilee called Nazareth.

Dan. 8:16- And I heard the voice of a man between *the banks of* Ulai, and he called out and said, "Gabriel, give this *man* an understanding of the vision."

Dan. 6:10- Now when Daniel knew that the document was signed, he entered his house (now in his roof chamber he had windows open toward Jerusalem); and <u>he continued kneeling</u> on his knees three times a day, praying and giving thanks before his God, ^[h]as he had been doing previously.

Rom. 15:30- Now I urge you, brethren, by our Lord Jesus Christ and by the love of the Spirit, to strive together with me in your prayers to God for me.

Exod. 29:39- The one lamb you shall offer in the morning and the [ad] other lamb you shall offer at [ae] twilight.

Dan. 6:10- Now when Daniel knew that the document was signed, he entered his house (now in his roof chamber he had windows open toward Jerusalem); and he continued kneeling on his knees three times a day, praying and giving thanks before his God, [h] as he had been doing previously.

Heb. 11:6- And without faith it is impossible to please *Him*, for he who comes to God must believe that He is and *that* He is a rewarder of those who seek Him.

Jas. 1:6-8- But he must ask in faith without any doubting, for the one who doubts is like the surf of the sea, driven and tossed by the wind. ⁷ For that man ought not to expect that he will receive anything from the Lord, ⁸ *being* a ^[i]double-minded man, unstable in all his ways.

- Jas. 1:5- But if any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all generously and [h]without reproach, and it will be given to him.
- Eph. 1:18-19- *I pray that* the eyes of your heart ^[x]may be enlightened, so that you will know what is the hope of His calling, what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the ^[y]saints, ¹⁹ and what is the surpassing greatness of His power toward us who believe. *These are* in accordance with the working of the strength of His might.
- Eph. 3:18-19- may be able to comprehend with all the ^[m]saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, ¹⁹ and to know the love of Christ which surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled up to all the fullness of God.
- 1 John 2:20- But you have an anointing from the Holy One, and you all know.
- 1John 2:27- As for you, the anointing which you received from Him abides in you, and you have no need for anyone to teach you; but as His anointing teaches you about all things, and is true and is not a lie, and just as it has taught you, ^[i]you abide in Him.
- Matt. 24:15- Therefore when you see the ABOMINATION OF DESOLATION which was spoken of through Daniel the prophet, standing in the holy place (let the reader understand)
- 1 Kings 3:5, 9-13- In Gibeon the LORD appeared to Solomon in a dream at night; and God said, "Ask what *you wish* Me to give you."... So give Your servant ^[d]an understanding heart to judge

Your people to discern between good and evil. For who is able to judge this ^[e]great people of Yours?"¹⁰ ^[f]It was pleasing in the sight of the Lord that Solomon had asked this thing. ¹¹ God said to him, "Because you have asked this thing and have not asked for yourself ^[g]long life, nor have asked riches for yourself, nor have you asked for the life of your enemies, but have asked for yourself ^[h]discernment to understand justice, ¹² behold, I have done according to your words. Behold, I have given you a wise and discerning heart, so that there has been no one like you before you, nor shall one like you arise after you. ¹³ I have also given you what you have not asked, both riches and honor, so that there will not be any among the kings like you all your days.

Eph. 3:20- Now to Him who is able to do far more abundantly beyond all that we ask or think, according to the power that works within us.
