



We have, most of us, been reared and now live under the influence of *Galatianism*. Protestant theology, alas, is for the most part, thoroughly *Galatianized*, in that neither law nor grace are given their distinct and separated places, as in the counsels of God, but are mingled together in one incoherent system. The law is no longer, as in the Divine intent, a ministration of death (2 Cor. 3:7), of cursing (Gal. 3:10), of conviction (Rom. 3:19), because we are taught that we must try to keep it, and that by Divine help we may. Nor, on the other hand, does grace bring us blessed deliverance from the dominion of sin, for we are kept under the law as a rule of life despite the plain declaration, "Sin shall not have dominion over you: for ye are not under the law, but under grace" (Rom. 6:14).

¹⁰ As Pharaoh drew near, the sons of Israel looked, and behold, the Egyptians were marching after them, and they became very frightened; so the sons of Israel cried out to the Lord. ¹¹ Then they said to Moses, "<u>Is it because there were no graves in Egypt that you have taken us away to die in the wilderness?</u> Why have you dealt with us in this way, bringing us out of Egypt? ¹² "Is this not the word that we spoke to you in Egypt, saying, 'Leave us alone that we may serve the Egyptians'? For <u>it would have been better for us to serve the Egyptians than to die in the wilderness."</u>






Romans 8:28-30 28 And we know that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose. 29 For those whom He foreknew, He also predestined to become conformed to the image of His Son, so that He would be the firstborn among many brethren; 30 and these whom He predestined, He also called; and these whom He called, He also justified; and these whom He justified, He also glorified.


• The Israelites thought that they were as good as dead with the Egyptians racing toward them on one side and the sea on the other.





















Law & Grace: Through The Sea <u>Without</u> Getting Wet!		
DEATH = SEPARATION; BEING ALIVE = UNION		
Rom. 6:1-11	- dead to sin, alive to Christ	
Rom. 7:1-6	 death releases one from marriage; died to the Law, joined to Christ 	
2 Cor. 5:14-15	- dead to ourselves, alive to Christ	
Gal. 2:19-20	- died to the Law, to live to God	
Col. 2:20	 died with Christ to the elementary principles of the world 	
Col. 3:5, 20	 dead to <u>sin</u>, died with Christ to <u>the</u> <u>world</u> 	

DEATH = SEPARATION; BEING ALIVE = UNION

Frequently some will say that the Apostle Paul is the one who explained these truths, (death is separation, and being alive is union), and that's true, however, the Apostle Peter also clearly understood these truths (death is separation, and being alive is union), that is, 'dead in relationship to, and alive in relationship to'. Consider 1 Peter 2:24:



4 Therefore, my brethren, you also were made to die to the Law through the body of Christ, so that you might be joined to another, to Him who was raised from the dead, in order that we might bear fruit for God. 5 For while we were in the flesh, the sinful passions, which were aroused by the Law, were at work in the members of our body to bear fruit for death. 6 But now we have been released from the Law, having died to that by which we were bound, so that we serve in newness of the Spirit and not in oldness of the letter.


