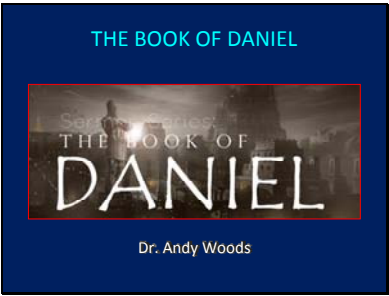


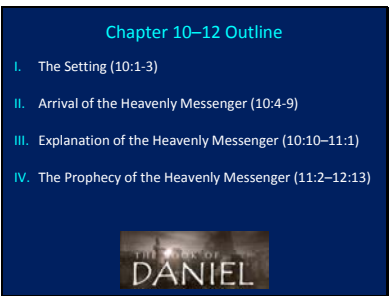

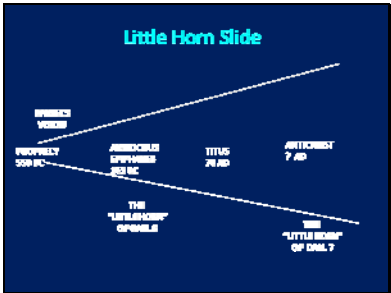

- Ptolemy I broke with Seleucus I
- Ptolemy I made Israel part of his empire

Daniel 11:6

1. Bernice (daughter of Ptolemy II) marries Antiochus Theos
2. Antiochus Theos brings back former wife Laodice when Ptolemy II dies
3. Laodice poisons Antiochus Theos, Bernice, and Bernice's children
4. Those Bernice brought from Egypt also destroyed
5. Laodice's son (Seleucus Callinicus) becomes ruler of the N.

2. Ptolemy III conquers King of the N. (Seleucus Callinicus)

3. Ptolemy III takes strongholds and wealth

4. Counter attack by Seleucus Callinicus was fruitless

1. Seleucus Callinicus has two sons: Seleucus III & Antiochus III

2. Seleucus III dies in battle

3. Throne taken by Antiochus III

4. Antiochus III becomes a powerful King of the N.

5. Antiochus III took sever cities in Israel from Ptolemy Philopater

6. Antiochus III brought the Kingdom of the N. to the very border of the Kingdom of the S.

1. Victories of Antiochus III against Ptolemy IV
2. Ptolemy IV vs. Antiochus III
3. Antiochus III favored
4. Ptolemy IV prevails
5. Antiochus III escapes with his life and is granted peace by Ptolemy IV
6. Ptolemy IV does not crush the N. in preference for living a life of ease

Daniel 11:13-16

1. Antiochus III recovers from defeat

2. Ptolemy IV dies suddenly thereby vacating Egypt's throne

3. Ptolemy V occupies the throne at age 6

4. Antiochus III saw this as an opportunity to invade Egypt

5. Antiochus III and Philip of Macedon invade Egypt

6. Many Egyptians sided with the invaders

7. Antiochus III did as he pleased, took Israel, and placed it under sovereignty of the N.

2. Cleopatra remains loyal to her husband (Ptolemy V) and not her father (Antiochus III)

Daniel 11:18-19

1. Antiochus III (discontent over prior victories) invades Greece
2. Rome tells Antiochus III to leave Greece alone
3. Antiochus III refuses to listen to Rome
4. Roman general Cornelius Scipio defeats Antiochus III
5. Antiochus III returns home and robs the Temple of Jupiter in order to compensate for depleted funds
6. Caused rebellion
7. Death of Antiochus III

2. Seleucus IV is forced to pay tribute to Rome

3. Consequently Seleucus IV heavily taxes his own people

4. Consequently Seleucus IV becomes unpopular with his own people

5. Consequently Seleucus IV sent tax collector Heliodorus to Jerusalem to plunder treasure from the Temple

6. Seleucus IV was poisoned by Heliodorus resulting in a sort reign of a few days

7. Lead up to Antiochus IV

Acts 20:27- For I did not shrink from declaring to you **the whole purpose of God.**

2 Tim. 3:16-**All Scripture** is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness.
