


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

# Preamble to Position Statements of SLBC Constitution

"Although agreement with the **POSITION STATEMENTS is** not required for membership, they are taught in this church. The **POSITION STATEMENTS are not meant to prohibit** honest and healthy discussions concerning what the Bible teaches about these issues; however, we believe that such discussions must be conducted under the guiding principle that believers are to strive to maintain unity."

#### SLBC Position Statement No. 7

"TEMPORARY SPIRITUAL GIFTS — This church teaches that the miraculous sign gifts, including the gift of tongues, (always the ability to speak in a previously unlearned, known language) along with the gift of healings were temporal gifts, given by the Holy Spirit solely to authenticate both the apostles and their message before the close of the canon of Scripture (1 Cor. 13:8-10). We do not believe that these are active as gifts today. However, we affirm that God is sovereign and may heal and/or give someone the ability to speak in a tongue (foreign language) today. We believe that the majority of what is termed 'miraculous' within the contemporary charismatic movement is something other than the Biblical gifts of tongues or healing."

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
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

# The 7 Disputed Gifts

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# 1 Corinthians 14:21-22

"21 In the Law it is written, 'By MEN OF STRANGE TONGUES AND BY THE LIPS OF STRANGERS I WILL SPEAK TO THIS PEOPLE, AND EVEN SO THEY WILL NOT LISTEN TO ME,' says the Lord. 22 So then tongues are for a sign, not to those who believe but to unbelievers; but prophecy is for a sign, not to unbelievers but to those who believe."



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## Acts 5:12, 15-16

"12 At the hands of the <u>apostles</u> many <u>signs</u> and wonders were taking place among the people; and they were all with one accord in Solomon's portico...<sup>15</sup> to such an extent that they even carried the sick out into the streets and laid them on cots and pallets, so that when Peter came by at least his shadow might fall on any one of them. <sup>16</sup> Also the people from the cities in the vicinity of Jerusalem were coming together, bringing people who were sick or afflicted with unclean spirits, and they were all being <u>healed</u>."



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### Romans 8:19-23

<sup>19</sup> "For the anxious longing of the creation waits eagerly for the revealing of the sons of God. <sup>20</sup> For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of Him who subjected it, in hope <sup>21</sup> that the creation itself also will be set free from its slavery to corruption into the freedom of the glory of the children of God. <sup>22</sup> For we know that **the whole creation groans** and suffers the pains of childbirth together until now. <sup>23</sup> And not only this, but also we ourselves, having the first fruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, waiting eagerly for our adoption as sons, the redemption of our body."

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# The Revelatory Gifts

- 1. Prophet (Deut. 18:18; 2 Pet. 1:20-21; Eph. 3:5; 1 Cor. 14:29-30; Acts 11:28; 21:10-11)
- 2. Knowledge (1 Cor. 13:2, 8-9; 14:6)
- 3. Tongues & Interpretation of tongues (1 Cor. 14:21-22 vs. 26-27)

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### 1 Corinthians 13:8-10

"8 Love never fails; but if there are gifts of **prophecy**, they will be done away; if there are **tongues**, they will cease; if there is **knowledge**, it will be done away. <sup>9</sup> For we know in part and we prophesy in part; <sup>10</sup> but when the perfect comes, the partial will be done away."



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# **Spiritual Gifts**

(1 Corinthians 12-14)

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### 1 Corinthians 13:11-13

"11 When I was a child, I used to speak like a child, think like a child, reason like a child; when I became a man, I did away with childish things. 12 For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face; now I know in part, but then I will know fully just as I also have been fully known. 13 But now faith, hope, love, abide these three; but the greatest of these is love."



### **Endurance of Love Emphasis** (1 Cor. 13:8-13)

- a. Unlike Love, the revelatory gifts will cease (8-10)
- b. Two illustrations (11-12)
  - a. Immaturity to maturity (11)
  - b. Limited to full sight (12)
- c. Unlike love, Faith and Hope will cease (13)

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# Three Interpretations of "The Perfect" [teleios] in 1 Cor. 13:10

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"It means that you and I, who have the Scriptures open before us, know much more than the apostle Paul of Gods truth...It means that we are altogether superior...even to the apostles themselves, including the apostle Paul! It means that we are now in a position which . . . 'we know, even as we are known' by God . . . indeed, there is only one word to describe such a view, it is nonsense."
