




- 1. SON = MESSIAH






















Revelation 3:7 in Progressive Dispensationalism

"The rule is extended from the Father to the disciple through the Son, the one who in Revelation 3:7 says he has 'the key of David.'. . . Here Jesus refers to himself as 'the one who has the key of David,' a phrase that contains a present participle . . . 'the one who has.' This is currently held Davidic authority."

Dr. Robert Thomas observes that, "As the root and offspring of David (cf. Rev. 5:5; 22:16), Christ in the fullest sense controls the entrance to David's house, which ultimately refers to the Messianic kingdom. . . . He is the genuine Messiah, and in the coming reign of glory His power to open the door to His own and close it to the self-styled 'children of the kingdom' is established (italics added)."



Israel in Prophecy (Grand Rapids: Zondervan, 1962), 84-85, 87.

"The covenant with David is not only given twice in its major content— namely, II Samuel 7 and I Chronicles 17—but it is also confirmed in Psalm 89. In this and other Old Testament references there is no allusion anywhere to the idea that these promises are to be understood in a spiritualized sense as referring to the church or to a reign of God in heaven. Rather, it is linked to the earth and to the seed of Israel, and to the land...There is no indication that this kingdom extended to a spiritual entity such as the church nor that the throne in view is the throne of God in heaven rather than the throne of David on earth...Such a situation does not prevail in this present age and is not related here or elsewhere to the reign of Christ from the throne of His Father in heaven."

Revelation 5:5 in Progressive Dispensationalism

"The victory, or at least the decisive act, has already occurred. He is qualified to open the scrolls and the seals because of what he has already done as a Davidite. . . . The timing of Revelation 5:5 is critical, since it precedes the seal judgments and the second coming, so the text shows Jesus has his regal victorious status before He returns in Revelation 19. The portrait of these Revelation texts is consistent. Jesus now rules in spiritual-salvific terms, in a new community that is part of the kingdom program, and in a way that inaugurates Davidic promises. That kingdom exists alongside the kingdoms of earth."






