## **2. Fulfilled Prophecy**

John 5:46-For if you believed Moses, you would believe Me, for he wrote about Me.

Peter Stoner- In 1969, Dr. Peter Stoner published a book called "Science Speaks." Dr. Stoner was the Chairman of the

Departments of Mathematics and Astronomy at Pasadena City College until 1953, when he became Chairman of the Science Division at Westmont College. In other words, he was a capable mathematician. And in "Science Speaks," Dr. Stoner calculated the probability that any one man could fulfill just these eight prophecies to be 1 chance in 10 to the 17th power, meaning a 1 with 17 zeros after it. To illustrate how unlikely a chance that would be, Stoner gave this illustration. Cover the entire state of Texas with silver dollars to a level of two feet deep. The total number of silver dollars needed would be 10 to the 17th power. Now, choose just one silver dollar, mark it, and put it back. Then thoroughly stir all the silver dollars all over the state. Now, blindfold someone and tell them they can travel wherever they want in Texas, but sometime they must pick one of the silver dollars. The chance of finding that one silver dollar that we marked in a pile 2 feet deep covering the state of Texas would be the chance the prophets had for these eight prophecies coming true in any one man in the future. ## **3. Predictions**

John 13:21- When Jesus had said this, He became troubled in spirit, and testified and said, "Truly, truly, I say to you, that one of you will betray Me."

Matt. 26:34- Jesus said to him, "Truly I say to you that this *very* night, before a rooster crows, you will deny Me three times."

Matt. 26:75- And Peter remembered the word which Jesus had said, "Before a rooster crows, you will deny Me three times." And he went out and wept bitterly.

Matt. 20:18-19-<sup>18</sup> "Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem; and the Son of Man will be delivered to the chief priests and scribes, and they will condemn Him to death, <sup>19</sup> and will hand Him over to the Gentiles to mock and scourge and crucify *Him*, and on the third day He will be raised up."

John 21:18-22-<sup>18</sup> Truly, truly, I say to you, when you were younger, you used to gird yourself and walk wherever you wished; but when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands and someone else will gird you, and bring you where you do not wish to *go*." <sup>19</sup> Now this He said, signifying by what kind of death he would glorify God. And when He had spoken this, He \*said to him, "Follow Me!" <sup>20</sup> Peter, turning around, \*saw the disciple whom Jesus loved following *them*; the one who also had leaned back on His bosom at the supper and said, "Lord, who is the one who betrays You?" <sup>21</sup> So Peter seeing him \*said to Jesus, "Lord, and what about this man?" <sup>22</sup> Jesus \*said to him, "If I want him to remain until I come, what *is that* to you? You follow Me!"

Luke 19:41-44-<sup>41</sup> When He approached *Jerusalem*, He saw the city and wept over it,<sup>42</sup> saying, "If you had known in this day, even you, the things which make for peace! But now they have been hidden from your eyes. <sup>43</sup> For the days will come upon you when your enemies will throw up a barricade against you, and surround you and hem you in on every side,<sup>44</sup> and they will level you to the ground and your children within you, and they

will not leave in you one stone upon another, because you did not recognize the time of your visitation.

# **<u>4. Morality</u>**

John 8:46-<u>Which one of you convicts Me of sin?</u> If I speak truth, why do you not believe Me?

1 Pet. 2:21-23-<sup>21</sup> For you have been called for this purpose, since Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example for you to follow in His steps, <sup>22</sup> WHO COMMITTED NO SIN, NOR WAS ANY DECEIT FOUND IN HIS MOUTH; <sup>23</sup> and while being reviled, He did not revile in return; while suffering, He uttered no threats, but kept entrusting *Himself* to Him who judges righteously

John 13:23- There was reclining on Jesus' bosom one of His disciples, whom Jesus loved.

1 John 2:1- My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. And if anyone sins, we have an Advocate with the Father, <u>Jesus Christ the righteous.</u>

Matt. 27:22-24-<sup>22</sup> Pilate said to them, "Then what shall I do with Jesus who is called Christ?" They all said, "Crucify Him!" <sup>23</sup> And he said, "Why, what evil has He done?" But they kept shouting all the more, saying, "Crucify Him!" <sup>24</sup> When Pilate saw that he was accomplishing nothing, but rather that a riot was starting, he took water and washed his hands in front of

the crowd, saying, "<u>I am innocent of this Man's blood</u>; see *to that* yourselves."

Mark 15:39- When the centurion, who was standing right in front of Him, saw the way He breathed His last, he said, "<u>Truly</u> <u>this man was the Son of God!</u>"

Matt. 22:46-No one was able to answer Him a word, nor did anyone dare from that day on to ask Him another question.

John 10:31-33-<sup>31</sup> The Jews picked up stones again to stone Him. <sup>32</sup> Jesus answered them, "I showed you many good works from the Father; for which of them are you stoning Me?" <sup>33</sup> The Jews answered Him, "For a good work we do not stone You, but for blasphemy; and because You, being a man, make Yourself out *to be* God."

# 6. Miracles

John 3:2- this man came to Jesus by night and said to Him, "Rabbi, we know that You have come from God *as* a teacher; for no one can do these signs that You do unless God is with him."

Matt. 11:2-5-<sup>2</sup> Now when John, while imprisoned, heard of the works of Christ, he sent *word* by his disciples <sup>3</sup> and said to Him, "Are You the Expected One, or shall we look for someone else?" <sup>4</sup> Jesus answered and said to them, "Go and report to John what you hear and see: <sup>5</sup> *the* BLIND RECEIVE SIGHT and *the* lame walk, *the* lepers are cleansed and *the* deaf hear, *the* dead are raised up, and *the* POOR HAVE THE GOSPEL PREACHED TO THEM. <sup>6</sup> And blessed is he who does not take offense at Me.

Mark 4:38- <sup>38</sup>Jesus Himself was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke Him and said to Him, "Teacher, do You

not care that we are perishing?" <sup>39</sup> And He got up and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, "Hush, be still." And the wind died down and it became perfectly calm. <sup>40</sup> And He said to them, "Why are you afraid? Do you still have no faith?" <sup>41</sup>They became very much afraid and said to one another, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey Him?"

Acts 2:22-Men of Israel, listen to these words: Jesus the Nazarene, a man attested to you by God with miracles and wonders and signs which God performed through Him in your midst, just as you yourselves know

John 2:11- <u>This beginning of *His* signs</u> Jesus did in Cana of Galilee, and manifested His glory, and His disciples believed in Him.

John 4:54- This is again a <u>second sign</u> that Jesus performed when He had come out of Judea into Galilee.

# 7. Resurrection

John 2:18-22-<sup>18</sup> The Jews then said to Him, "What sign do You show us as your authority for doing these things?" <sup>19</sup> Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." <sup>20</sup> The Jews then said, "It took forty-six years to build this temple, and will You raise it up in three days?" <sup>21</sup> But He was speaking of the temple of His body. <sup>22</sup> So when He was raised from the dead, His disciples remembered that He said this; and they believed the Scripture and the word which Jesus had spoken.

John 19:32-34-<sup>32</sup> So the soldiers came, and broke the legs of the first man and of the other who was crucified with Him; <sup>33</sup> but coming to Jesus, when they saw that He was already dead, they did not break His legs. <sup>34</sup> But one of the soldiers pierced His side with a spear, and immediately blood and water came out.
