RESURRECTIONS IN REVIEW - 1 COR. 15:23

- 1. Definition of Resurrection
 - a) Anthropology Man is material; immaterial (1 Thess 5:23)
 - b) Death = separation (Matt 27:50; Acts 7:59)
 - c) Resurrection = reunion
 - d) Resurrection is not a resuscitation

 - We are not currently fit for eternity (1 Cor 15:50)
 - Our present bodies are under a curse (Gen 3:19)

Differences Between the Earthly and Heavenly Bodies (15:42-44) Earthly Body Perishable Lowly Weak Natural Powerful Spiritual






RESURRECTION IS THE HEART OF THE GOSPEL (15:1-11)

- Definition of the Gospel (1-4)
- Predicted in the Old Testament (4)
- Attested to by eyewitnesses (5-11)

RESURRECTION OF CHRIST PREDICTED IN THE OLD TESTAMENT (15:1-4)

- Ps 16:10 For You will not abandon my soul to Sheol; Nor will You allow Your Holy One to undergo decay. (NASB95)
- Isaiah 53:10 But the Lord was pleased to crush Him, putting Him to grief; If He would render Himself as a guilt offering, He will see His offspring, He will prolong His days, And the good pleasure of the Lord will prosper in His hand. (NASB95)

- Positive impact upon daily life (58)


