Paul's Coming (Gal 2:1) Paul's Ministry in Antioch (Acts 11:25-26) Paul, Barnabas, Titus bring famine relief to Jerusalem (Acts 11:27-30)

Paul's Concern (Gal 2:2)

- Paul was not concerned: the Jerusalem apostle's would disapprove of his message
- Paul <u>was</u> concerned: his critics would say that he had no fellowship with the Jerusalem apostles due to Paul's false gospel

Slide 12

Paul's Companion (Gal 2:3)

- <u>Titus</u>: a Gentile
- <u>Circumcision</u>: rite by which a

 Gentile male became an OT proselyte
- <u>Judaizers</u>: justification/sanctification through submission to the Law
- <u>Apostles</u>: did not compel Titus to be circumscribed

Paul's Conviction (Gal 2:4-5)

- <u>Judaizers in Jerusalem</u>: bondage (4)
- Paul's response: no compromise (5)

Paul's Commission (Gal 2:6-9)

- Apostles:
 - contributed nothing to Paul's doctrine (6)
 - recognized Paul's apostleship was just as legitimate as Peter's (7-8)
 - ◆ commissioned Paul to go to the Gentiles (9)

Did not change Paul's doctrine
Only asked Paul to remember the poor
