


"About this time there lived <u>Jesus</u>, a wise man, if indeed one ought to call him a man. For he was one who performed surprising deeds and was a teacher of such people as accept the truth gladly. He won over many Jews and many of the Greeks. He was <u>the Christ</u>. And when, upon the accusation of the principal men among us, Pilate had condemned him to a cross, those who had first come to love him did not cease. He appeared to them spending a third day restored to life, for <u>the prophets of God had foretold these things</u> and a thousand other marvels about him. And the tribe of the Christians, so called after him, has still to this day not disappeared."





- the smitten good shepherd (13:7)




Christ in Zechariah SECOND ADVENT
